

With the support of the ANR-PLIC project (Pashto Literature between Identity and Contact, 2023-2028), this academic event highlights the writing practices of Afghan writers in exile, exploring the complex themes of identity, exile and the role of literature in cultural preservation. Through a series of presentations and discussions, participants will have the opportunity to deepen their understanding of the role of women in Pashto literature, the ways in which writers express their identity in a context of exile, and the challenges and opportunities emerging from this dynamic.
